## Arcyria major (G.Lister) Ing

**Date** 30 Aug. 2019 Black Sugarloaf, Birralee (thismia gully). **Habitat** wet eucalypt forest. **Substrate** sodden bark of fallen *Eucalyptus obliqua*. **Description** several patches of densely packed coral pink sporangia. **Sporotheca** cylindrical **Stalk** 0.2–0.3 mm, reddish brown, the base is white and filled with cysts. **Hypothallus** continuous under group. **Peridium** fugacious leaving a funnel-shaped calyculus covered with papillae (oil immersion lens). **Capillitium** falls away from the calyculus in 6 mm long plumes that retain their shape (unlike *A. affinis*). Decorated with spirals, 5 μm wide. Pink at first then ochraceous. **Spores** 8 μm, decorations not visible. **Notes** developing sporangia changed colour from white, to ochraceous (like *A. obvelata*) to pink. **Below** *A. major* showing the changing colour as the sporangia develop.
