Arcyria pausiaca H.W. Keller & Bub. Zurey

Date 30 May 2014. Black Sugarloaf, Birralee (thismia gully). Habitat wet eucalypt forest. Substrate stag of dead fallen Eucalyptus obliqua. Description Scattered and crowded sessile to very shortly stalked sporangia. Sporangia globose, sandy brown, 0.2-0.7 mm diameter. **Peridium** iridescent peridium persists on some sporangia, very small calyculus. Reticulum on calyculus observed with oil immersion lens. Hypothallus inconspicuous **Stalk** very short, < 0.1 mm long but absent in most sporangia. Capillitium brown in mass, attached to base of calyculus, branching at nodes, decorated with rings, half rings and reticulate ridges and some warts, 4-5 µm wide with some thickenings. Spores sandy brown in mass, light brown by transmitted light, scattered warts, 10 μm.
